WORLD AUTISM UNDERSTANDING DAY

Developed in 2007 by the United Nations (UN), World Autism Awareness Day is celebrated each year on 2 April .

The colour and symbol used by the Autistic community is the infinity symbol, in rainbow or gold.

The infinity symbol is used to represent inclusion of all people. The broader neurodiversity movement also uses the rainbow infinity symbol.

Rainbow is to reflect the diversity of the autism spectrum.

Gold – 'Au' is the symbol for the chemical element, gold. Additionally, the Autistic community consider themselves rare and valuable, just like gold.

So get your rainbow or your gold fashion ready and wear with pride on Tuesday the 2nd of April (next week), and celebrate our rare and valuable students.

Healthy Lunch box snacks

High school 8 this term for visual arts have been working on 2D art.

They learned about the lightness and darkness of an object and how still life objects can cast a shadow. They added white to a colour to make the colour change from dark to lighter and practising drawing still life objects.

Once all these techniques had been mastered they completed a 2D art collage. They ripped up newspaper to create a background, coloured their still life objects using light and dark hues of colour and pasted the pieces against the background. To finish they used black charcoal to draw a shadow on the dark side of the object to give the effect of the object casting a shadow. The students did a fantastic job!

You are an important part of our school community. We know that you play a crucial role in helping your child become a motivated learner. Communication between our school and our community is critical for us to partner together.

To give our teachers the opportunity to recharge, spend time with their families and bring their best creative selves to work, we are setting clear expectations for when and how they respond to communication outside school operating hours. This means teachers may not reply to non-emergency messages or emails outside of school operating hours.

Please ring the school or use the school's email address for non-emergencies in the first instance or Class Dojo between the hours of 8:30am and 3:30pm. Our staff will respond to your queries within 2 school days under normal circumstances.

For longer discussions or complex matters, we ask parents and carers to make an appointment to speak to teachers directly, at a time that works best for everyone.

For emergencies, please contact myself or Heather during the school day, we are generally available to 5pm most days. Emergencies include serious student health, safety and wellbeing issues.

Our staff will always stay in touch because open communication is what's best for your child and their education. We don't want you to stop communicating with your teachers – we still want to hear from you if you have any questions or need to discuss a matter about your child. We know it's often easier to send emails or messages after work. We will make sure we read and respond in school operating hours.

Our dedicated teachers want to help our students achieve their best – we're on the same team.
