







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Dear parents and carers,

I hope that all families were able to find somewhere to be safe and cool as we endured our first taste of summer. The students enjoyed a few sessions of movies in the hall or classrooms to keep out of the heat.

Future curriculum delivery

The teachers are currently working hard to create a more streamlined delivery of the curriculum.

In the Primary years we will work hard towards 50% of everyday developing skills in English and mathematics, while the rest of the day will be for PDHPE, history and geography, creative arts(dance, music, art and drama) science and technology including time working with the bot robots.

Throughout years 7-10, the focus will be on the mandatory subjects delivered over the four years and with a continued emphasis on English and mathematics. The students will have technology (food), history and geography, music, visual arts, PDHPE, science and technology and Indonesian lessons across the week. There will also be the opportunity for these students to develop skills outside of the classroom environment dependant upon individual student behaviours.

The senior years (11-12) is the area with the greatest change. We will only be offering the following six subjects: English, mathematics, PDHPE, food technology, visual arts and workers in the community. The students are required to achieve a minimum of one outcome per subject to achieve the HSC Life Skills over 240 hours study. We wish to increase the amount of time that the students are learning outside the classroom preparing for life after Para Meadows. This will be delivered to all students with additional support for students experiencing difficulties with behaviour.

"Heads Up" from Merryl

"Heads Up" is a quick reminder or hint that families may find useful.

Todays "Heads Up" is on being a NDIS nominee.

A nominee under the NDIS is justified when it is not possible for the participant to be assessed to make decisions for themselves.

When the young person is under 18 the person with parental responsibility makes these decisions.

When the young person turns 18 you must apply to the NDIA to be the nominee for your young person if you wish to make decisions on their behalf.

If you wish to be the nominee an application needs to be completed as soon as your young person turns 18. The NDIS cannot communicate with you after your young person turns 18 if you are not the nominee.

Attached is the Nominee form you will need to complete. You will need to take 100 points of ID with you to the NDIA or Uniting office. The young person needs to agree to you being the nominee.
